Guided Tour Stops

THE GRUBER WAGON WORKS

A tour of the Gruber Wagon Works highlights the intricate process of wagon making and the evolution of how a rural, family run factory, operated over 90 years.

The Gruber Wagon Works provides a

lesson for students on simple machines, early industry, transportation, and changing technology.



This museum explores the history of the Union Canal and the Schuylkill

Navigation System.
Students will be guided through the museum.
Artifacts and exhibits highlight canal history, the boats that traveled them, and what life was

like for families that lived and worked along the canals. Time is also allotted for students to visit Mildred the Houseboat.

EPLER'S ONE ROOM SCHOOLHOUSE

A new addition to the Heritage Center is the mid-19th century Epler's Schoolhouse.
Students will learn how school was run more than 100 years ago.

SALAD AND HERB GARDEN

Our salad and herb garden contains a variety of plants used by European Settlers. Students will discover how these plants and herbs were used by these families for cooking and medicine.
